## About Google Pay

PXP's Gateway supports payments made using Google Pay™. These wallets can be used to enhance mobile purchasing experiences for Consumers with supported devices and produce a payment token that can be passed to the Gateway instead of the Cardholder's actual card details. You can use these wallets with any Merchant Account that has been configured to accept them.

# Setting up Google Pay

The instructions below go through how to set up Google Pay on your Gateway Merchant account:

1. To use Google Pay with the Gateway you first need to apply for a Google Pay Merchant account.
2. Visit [pay.google.com/business/console/](https://pay.google.com/business/console/) and login or create a new account.
3. Next, click '**Getting Started**' under the business profile section.

This is where your business information is kept. It needs to be completed before you can launch anything.

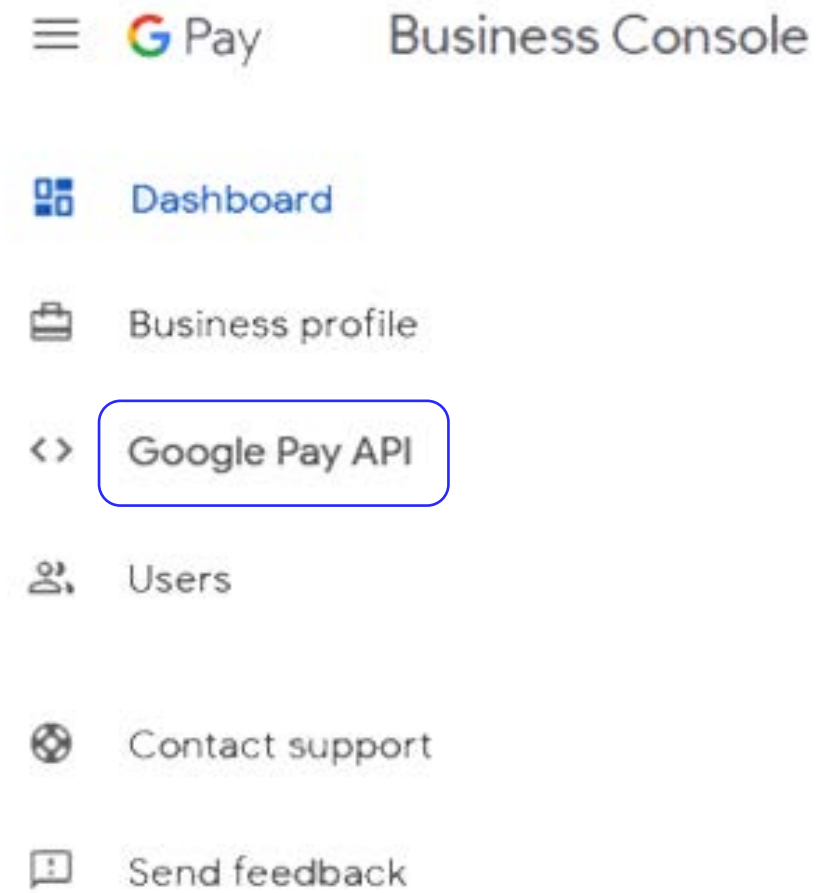

4. You can add the Item selection, **Pre-purchase** and **Post purchase** screenshots from your own website. To obtain screen shots for your Payment method and **Google Pay API screens**, you will need to use your Merchant Test account (if this has not yet been enabled, you will need to contact your Gateway Support Team to enable Google Pay on your test account).
5. Submit your payment flow for review. Please note Google can take up to 14 days to complete the verification process.

6. Once approved, your Google Pay Merchant ID will appear in the top right of your Business Console page. Add this ID under the Google Pay section in the Merchant Management System (MMS) (*found under the Digital Wallets section of the Preferences screen*). Then click **'Update Google Pay Preferences'**.
7. Your account is now set up to use Google Pay and this ID can be used for multiple Gateway Merchant accounts if they fall under the same registered Domain as the Google Account.
